

Spirituality runs as a key thread through our whole school curriculum – part of our hidden curriculum. ## Visits and Visitors

- ⇒ These are an integral part of the education for children at Charlton. We value the opportunities such visits offer our children and the commitment of staff in undertaking them.

## Special Educational Needs



### SENCO—Mrs Katherine Martin

Charlton Church of England Primary School is committed to inclusion and to the development of cultures, policies and practices that include all learners. We aim to encourage a sense of community and belonging, and to develop an environment where all children are equally valued, reach their full potential, can flourish and feel safe.

It is our policy to meet the needs of all children who experience barriers to their learning. This may relate to sensory or physical impairment, learning difficulties or emotional or social development. These barriers may relate to factors in their environment at both home and school.

We recognise that pupils learn at different rates and that there are many factors affecting achievement, including attendance, ability, emotional state, age and maturity. We believe that many pupils, at some time in their school career, may experience difficulties which affect their learning, and we recognise that these may be long or short term. We aim to identify these needs as they arise and provide teaching and learning opportunities which enable every child to achieve to his or her full potential. This may include additional provision.

We aim to work closely with parents. The SEN Code of Practice (2015) puts parents at the heart of the discussion about how best to support their children and ensures that we can look forward to working in even closer partnership with parents and health professionals to ensure Charlton children get the best possible support and make good progress.

On the SEN team we have a Teaching Assistant who delivers Speech and Language interventions, and a play therapist; a physical intervention coach, together with our Family Liaison Officer, who supports our parents with a wide variety of matters. We also have a trained ELSA and Nurture Support Assistant who support with the emotional wellbeing and development of our children.

## **Our School Day**

The gates open at **8.35am**.

Registers open at **8.50am and close at 9.00am**.

The school day ends at **3.15pm.** 

The school office is open to visitors from 8:00am to 5:30pm on school days.

Telephone calls can be taken from 7:30am to 5:30pm, with an answerphone service available outside of those hours.

Our weekly school hours are 32.5 hours per week.

We run an *Early Bird Club* which starts at *8am* each day, in which breakfast can be provided. With additional time available from *7:30am* if booked beforehand.

We also run an *After School Club* which ends at *5pm* each day, with a *5:30pm* pick up available to working parents, in which children canhave a snack and play games until they are collected.





Class teachers and our sports coach also run after school clubs until 4pm such as:

- Chess

## **Admissions**

Like all schools we have an admission policy, which sets out the admissions criteria. Applications for transfer to primary school for Reception year in September 2024 open on **Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> November 2024** and close on **Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2025**.
