Planning is creative and each subject's skill progression grid shows how skills are developed and built on from Reception to Year 6. The curriculum is well-resourced. Where appropriate, knowledge is taught through 'Big Questions' for topics.</p> <p><i>Enriched curriculum</i> Educational visits, visitors, special weeks, special days, community links and collaboration events (within our MAT and network of local schools) enhance learning for our pupils and provide a range of opportunities and experiences.</p> <p><i>Growth Mindset</i> Children are encouraged to be resilient, reflective and independent learners. Mistakes are used as teaching points; we try again. We use the language of BLP.</p>	<p>Children leave Charlton as confident, independent and reflective learners; ready for the next stage in their education. They have developed the knowledge and skills they need to be 'secondary ready'.</p> <p>Children also move on to their secondary school with an understanding of how make positive contributions to society.
