

### Pastoral Care and Nurture Provision

Our context: 41% Pupil Premium, 25% EAL, 19% SEN We provide exceptional pastoral/nurture support thus enabling all children and their families to thrive in and out of school



- **ELSA:** works with focus children
- Emotional Wellbeing Team: brain buddies, circle of friends, PSHE workshops, 1:1 intense support, parent intense support
- Family Liaison Officer: food back, hygiene bank, fuel bank, clothing bank
- Work with agencies and specialists for children and their families: Migrant Help, Early Help, School Nurse, Social Services, Homestart, Speech and Language, Educational Psychologists, Specialist Teachers, Project SALUS, NELFT, IncludesU2, Inspire Fund (e.g. support for swimming, dance etc), paediatrician
- Therapy dog Rosa works with some of our most vulnerable pupils to provide emotional regulation support
- Play Therapist employed directly by the school for focus children
- From January 2023 we will be accessing a farm for enrichment opportunities for enrichment opportunities
