Maths

Mass

Use and read scales to measure mass in kilograms and grams. Understand equivalent masses and compare mass. Add, subtract and solve problems involving mass.

Capacity

Measure capacity and volume in liters and milliliters. Find equivalent amounts of capacity and volume and compare. Add, subtract and solve problems involving capacity and volume.

Fractions

Add, subtract and solve problems involving fractions. Partition the whole, find unit and non-unit fractions of a set of objects and reason with fractions of an amount.

Assessments using PIXL

<u>RE – Kingdom of God, 'When Jesus left, what was the impact of Pentecost?'</u>

- Pentecost was when the holy spirit was given to Jesus' Apostles on the seventh Sunday after Easter.
- Christians celebrate Pentecost as the beginning of the Church.
- 3,000 people were Baptised during the day of Pentecost. This meant they accepted Jesus as King of their lives and joined the 'Kingdom of God'
- Jesus' whole life was a demonstration of his belief that God is King.
